Traveling to some of the Capitals that Border on the Baltic Sea – Bill Sumits



Never having traveled to the Baltic countries, or even knowing much about them, we booked a tour covering the Baltic capitals and included St Petersburg in Russia, which was our primary reason for traveling.

One of the world's most magnificent cities, St. Petersburg was built at the mouth of the Neva River early in the 18th century by Peter the Great, who

wished to create a Russian capital to rival the splendor of Paris. Peter also wanted a splendid summer palace which he built in 1714, called Peterhof. The gardens and gilded fountains of Peterhof are spectacular.

St. Petersburg is called the "Venice of the North" because of its many picturesque islands, canals, and bridges. Along one of the canals is the colorful "Church on the Spilled Blood". It was built on the site where Emperor Alexander II was fatally wounded by political nihilists in March 1881.

The city is probably better known for the Hermitage Museum and its collection of magnificent art, much of which was collected by Catherine the Great. The newest addition for 20th century art houses a remarkable number of impressionist and post impressionist art works. Also of interest is the Faberge museum with treasures of the Romanovs.

Vilnius, the capital of Lithuania, distinguished itself as an important



cultural center when Vilnius University opened in 1579. The cobbled streets of the city's compact Old Town provide many photo opportunities, with the carefully restored Baroque buildings and medieval charm that earned it UNESCO World Heritage status......read more
