Behind the Image:

I was hired to take new marketing photos for a small contemporary dance company. The idea was to shoot a rehearsal ahead of their upcoming Mexico tour. At the end of the rehearsal, one of the company members began taking 'head shots' of fellow dancers and I slipped in to take a few as well. As the judge surmised, this was one of about 20 images I fired off as the dancer worked through various poses. It was shot with a Sony a7Rii, 55mm lens at f2.8 and 1/125s at ISO 500. It was lit with natural light streaming in through the studio windows. Processing was in Lightroom and Nik Silver Efex Pro.

While walking through the Gamla Stan, Stockholm's "old town", I noticed this bicycle parked in an alleyway. Since cycling is such a key mode of transportation in Stockholm, I thought that this shot would be a nice way to combine a character element of the city with the charm of Gamla Stan. The photo was taken with a Leica M Monochrome and a 50mm Summilux lens at f2.4 for 1/90 sec.


